PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE:

ST. JOSEPH'S INVITED TO WALK THE PATH OF RECONCILIATION



I am very excited about the upcoming National Day of Truth and Reconciliation, September 30. Many of us have been moved by the stories of those who have gone to residential schools and want to do what we can to begin to walk the path of reconciliation with the First Nations on whose traditional territories we reside.

Island Catholics Schools has chosen "Truth, Healing and Reconciliation" as our theme for the year. We will be having a special memorial mass 9:00a.m. on Thursday, September 29. Parents and grandparents are welcome to join us. We have also been invited to the South Island Powwow at Royal Athletic Park, 1014 Caledonia Avenue, on Friday, September 30, the National Day of Truth

and Reconciliation, from 10:00 a.m. until midnight. There will be two Grand Entries, one at 11:00 a.m. and one at 6:00 p.m. The Grand Entries will be followed by Intertribal Dances and Category dancing. You have a choice of attending the daytime event or the evening event — or both if you wish! This event is free to attend.

The South Island Powwow is an opportunity to celebrate traditional Indigenous cultures and resiliency through song and dance. They look to hold space and honour the residential school, day school and 60s scoop Survivors and their families. They will bring people together for celebration and to build bridges amongst all nations. I encourage all members of St. Joseph's School Community to support this event. For those of us who have been interested in furthering the process of reconciliation, this is an invitation from the First Nations themselves and a wonderful opportunity to show our commitment to Truth, Healing and Reconciliation.

The Songhees First Nation had requested volunteers to help. Unfortunately, there was a deadline for sign up that we did not know about until it was too late. I have contacted the Songhees contact for this event to see if they still need volunteers, and if we can join in. Watch for an upcoming email once I have heard back from them. In any event, perhaps the best way to show our support would just be to show up. I'll see you there!

Vice Principal's Message

Dear Parents.

At the start of the school year, our Superintendent of Island Catholic Schools (Mrs. Beverly Pulyk) shared the "Updated CISDV Communicable Disease Plan." This document is available for you to read at: https://cisdv.bc.ca. Of particular importance, we kindly ask that you carefully read the following very important section from page 5 of the document:

Health Awareness

Staff, parents, caregivers, students, and visitors should not come to school if they are sick and unable to participate fully in routine activities. The importance of everyone doing a health check remains in place. A health check means a person regularly checking before coming to school to ensure they (or their child) are experiencing symptoms of illness (including but not limited to COVID-19 symptoms) that would limit their ability to participate fully in regular activities.

A daily check helps prevent the spread of communicable diseases, such as COVID-19, within the school setting.

School administrators should ensure that everyone entering a school is aware and routinely reminded of their responsibility to practice health awareness, including that they should not come to school if they are sick.

What To Do When Sick

Staff, students, or other persons in the school setting who are exhibiting symptoms of illness, such as COVID-19 or gastrointestinal illness, should stay home until they are well enough to participate in regular activities. Staff, children, or other persons can attend school if their symptoms are consistent with a previously diagnosed health condition (e.g., seasonal allergies) or symptoms have improved enough to where one feels well enough to return to regular activities and any fever has resolved without the use of fever-reducing medication (e.g., acetaminophen, ibuprofen). The When to Get Tested for COVID-19 resource or the B.C. Self- Assessment Tool provides more information on whether you should get a test for COVID-19. If you are unsure or concerned about your symptoms, connect with your health care provider, or call 8-1-1.

Staff, children, or other persons in the school setting who test positive for COVID-19 are to follow the guidance on the BCCDC website as to how long they should self-isolate. They can return to school when they no longer need to self-isolate as long as symptoms have improved, and they are well enough to participate in regular activities. Schools do NOT require a health care provider note (i.e., a doctor's note) to confirm the health status of any individual, beyond those required to support medical accommodation as per usual practice.

If a **staff member, student, or other person** develops symptoms of illness at school and is unable to participate in regular activities, they will be supported to go home until their symptoms have improved. Appropriate infection control precautions are to be taken while the person is preparing to leave the school premises, including use of appropriate hand hygiene and cleaning/disinfection of surfaces soiled with bodily fluids. The ill person may use a mask if they are experiencing respiratory symptoms.


