### ST. JOSEPH'S SURVIVES A THREATENING INCIDENT!

As we all know, the week started off with a disturbing incident on St. Joseph's School grounds. I have been expecting a copy of the official Saanich Police Report to share with you but as our municipal police have many pressing matters to address, we may have to wait a little longer for it. I would like to ensure I gave a final summation to you before the weekend so here is the best rendition of events that I have been able to gather.

Prior to 8:00 a.m. a man behaving erratically was in the vicinity of the school Passersby attempted to help him and realizing that something was amiss, phoned the police for a wellness check. At 7:50 a.m. a parent and a staff member had approached the individual to offer assistance and shortly after the police arrived. At that time the police noticed that the individual had a gun.

The staff member immediately informed the office and we initiated a Hold and Secure Lockdown of the school. When we say lock down, we often are referring to a threat being in the school building and the teachers and students "hide" in an area of the classroom with doors are locked. This was a Hold and Secure Lockdown, which means we are responding to a threat in the neighbourhood and we just keep people in the building. The situation was resolved quickly, and once the police had given us the "all clear" we were able to let the children go out for some activity prior to the beginning of the school day.

During morning announcement, I reassured students that the incident was over and everyone was safe. Later in the day, Constable Alex visited our school, confirmed that the individual was merely passing by and that the gun was a replica. I had hoped to share that information with the police report, but as this was not possible, I will share it now.

During this event, several social media posts were circulated and were causing distress among the parent community. We sent a text out to reassure parents that the Hold and Secure Lockdown was lifted, but that caused further distress among parent who had not heard. We have reviewed our messaging and will be better prepared to deliver messaging less alarming in the future. Part of the problem is the program we use only allows 140 characters.

Every incident and drill gives us an opportunity to further refine our practice. Thank you to all the parents who gave us feedback. We have used it in our discussion for future drills and events.

And my sincere commendation to the staff. They have been well trained and our primary goal of swiftly and securely ensuring the safety of students was exemplary. Well done, St. Joseph's.

Also, this morning we brought students in to the school first thing. Spraying for moths, which was supposed to occur Sunday, April 28, was rescheduled for Friday. The Ministry of Forests informed us that spraying would be done by 7:30 a.m. and "to avoid contact with the spray, stay indoors for up to an hour following treatment." Therefore, to ensure the health of our students, we started the day indoors and asked for rigorous handwashing following outdoor recess play.
