FRIENDLY REMINDERS FROM THE OFFICE

Parent Involvement Program (PIP) cheque is now due.

IF you have not already done so, please submit your cheque for \$150 postdated to June 15, 2025 to the office as soon as possible. IF you do not have cheques, money can be sent via e- transfer to sjv@cisdv.bc.ca or you can pay by cash or credit/debit in the office.

All families are required to contribute a minimum of 10 volunteer hours to the school each year. Each school year we require a June 15th post-dated cheque of \$150 from you and return it when you have completed your hours. If the volunteer hours are not fulfilled within the school year, the \$150 cheque will be deposited and cashed.

Grandparents and other family members can fulfill the required hours if necessary.

There are a wide variety of ways to fulfill your volunteer hours. Parents go on field trips, read with students, help teachers, or assist in the office, fulfill some custodial or grounds keeping tasks, participate in fundraisers, work bees, or many other volunteer opportunities.

To volunteer for most school activities, a criminal record check is required. Please contact the office for further information if you do not have a current Criminal Record check on file with us. We can provide you with further information.

ULTIMATE FRISBEE


